Eden Shaw is a 20-year-old virgin, which wouldn't have been so unusual in 1981. Her mother and father divorced when she was 3 and her mother remarried. She considers him her real dad.

She receives a visit from a man, Jason Earle, who knows her biological grandfather, David Morton. David has a heart condition and isn't expected to live long; he wants to see Eden before he dies.

Eden takes an immediate dislike to Jason Earle, who, in his 30s, is mature and sophisticated, whereas Eden is very young, naive, and sees the world as black and white. But it's a hate/love/hate thing. She says she hates them, then she's in love with him; yet she lies to him, lets him/encourages him to think that she sleeps around.

This book was published 34 years ago. Even though I was a teenager at that time, some things in this book are quite shocking. For example, Eden's stepfather slaps her -- a 20-year-old woman-- for speaking angrily to her mother, and she had justification for being angry. The slap wasn't even remarked upon! If that happened

nowadays, she would certainly have filed for a protective order and probably filed charges against him!

So much drama in this book! It was exhausting and plainly off-putting. Jason is described as having violence just below the surface. I wager that it's only a short time until Eden is a battered wife. And Eden's immature, silly behavior would drive any man insane.

The one positive thing about this book is that the writing and editing was impeccable. That is the reason I finished it - it flows smoothly and, thank God, quickly- also, it's like watching a train wreck in that you just can't look away!
