The Way Home is the second book in Cindy Gerard's *One-Eyed Jacks* series, but don't let the cover fool you! Yeah, this is a romantic tale filled with the kind of joy the holidays deliver, but it's also one exciting, heartbreaking, uplifting, steamy, and hope inspiring love story.

The Story

Four years ago Jess got the news every Army wife dreads - her husband has been killed in action and won't be returning home to her. She had struggled with Jeff's Special Forces 'here today, gone tomorrow' assignments, and they'd even fought about it before his last deployment, but his death left a gaping, empty place inside her, one she tried to fill - or mask - by throwing herself into work. But Tyler Brown, ex-military hero and all around sexy, alpha male, has Jess realizing that maybe it's time to stop merely existing, and time to start living again. And maybe even love again. Wedding plans are set and these two wonderful people who have both known great loss are looking forward to a future filled with the kind of love they never thought they'd find again, when word comes down that Jeff's been found alive - though not necessarily well - and a team is being sent to Afghanistan to rescue him and bring him home.

My Thoughts

This type of storyline is tough to write and even tougher to write well, but Cindy Gerard has pulled it off with flying colors! I wasn't sure what to expect, but I should have known better than to doubt Ms. Gerard's ability to tell a story that would draw me in and touch me deeply.

Tyler Brown, younger brother to *Killing Time*'s Mike Brown, is such an amazing guy. He's not your typical action romance novel hero, but he's a hero, nonetheless. Caring, compassionate, sexy-as-sin, and patient yet determined to get what he wants - he's got what it takes to get my *swoon-worthy* stamp of approval.

Jess turned out to be every bit as amazing as Ty. She's also compassionate and caring, but I respected her for her loyalty to Jeff and her honesty with Ty and Jeff, both. She's strong and independent, but she's got an ability to love and nurture that made me admire and care about her and her happiness.

I'll admit that the *happily ever afters* fell into place a bit quicker and more conveniently than is realistic or likely to happen, but as I said, this is one of those special love stories, the kind that we hope for, the kind that happens through the magic of Christmas.

The woman who rescued him, Rabia, has gone from a reluctant nurse to a compassionate caregiver in the months that she and her father have given him refuge. Besides his grave physical injuries and amnesia, Jeff has no way to contact the American soldiers without alerting the enemy to Rabia's help. And as his health improves, he and the beautiful forbidden woman form a bond that started from necessity and turns into a passion that neither could have expected.

Jess has been a widow for over three years after her husband Jeff was killed in action in Afghanistan. She's now running her parents business in a small town and hasn't really let herself move on. After a random meeting over a year ago with a black ops group who came into her store needing any weapons she could provide, she took them to Jeff's gun safe and gave them their pick. It was that moment when she met Tyler Brown and even with that quick meeting, she never got the man out of her head. He took her number but never got in contact with her and even though she tried to forget about him, she couldn't. Tyler had his own issues he was dealing with in his home state of Florida that kept him from reaching out to Jess, but he's back now to see if what's between them has any chance of becoming something more.

Meanwhile half way around the world, Jeff wasn't killed in action, but rather was captured, tortured and held all this time after his team was caught in an explosion. He managed to finally escape but is in no physical condition to do anything. He was saved on the side of a road by Rabia, who puts her life and that of her father's on the line when she takes Jeff in to help him recover and hides him from the Taliban who are actively searching for the missing American. He stays with Rabia for months, initially having no memory of who he is or what happened to him. Slowly the memories come back but only so far back as the explosion. He has no memory prior to that time and he's still dealing with many medical issues including a broken leg that was never properly set, intense vertigo and severe malnutrition. Seeing him through all of this is Rabia, a woman who is terrified that they'll be found out but she can't turn her back on this man who needs her. She cares for him, helps him regain some of his strength and they become closer over the weeks as his memory starts to come to him in bits and pieces.

Having read the book's blurb ahead of time, I had no clue how Cindy Gerard was going to make this work. I did NOT want to become emotionally invested in Jess and Tyler to only have Jeff come back into the picture, make this a love triangle and have some poor person be the odd man out because I knew I'd end up feeling deeply for all the characters caught in this impossible situation. I'm not sure I could have handled that and I was very pleased with how everything plays out. I can't say that one couple stood out more to me than the other as I ended up becoming attached to both Ty and Jess as well as Jeff and Rabia. Through Jess, we get some details about her marriage with Jeff and it's made clear that while there was love between them,

Jess wasn't happy in the marriage because for Jeff, service to his country came #1, everything else including Jess came after that and it wasn't enough for her. So it wasn't all sunshine and roses for this couple and it took away a little bit of the relationship suspense early on since it was clear their marriage wouldn't be much of an issue once Jeff came back into Jess's life.

I adore Tyler and loved his presence in Jess's life. I found them to be a couple that I couldn't get enough of and he's so honorable that when he found out there was a chance that Jeff was alive and that the Black Ops team, including Ty's brother Mike, was heading out on a rescue mission, he put himself on the team, against Jess's wishes. He didn't stand in Jess's way when it came to Jeff and I guess if I had one niggle it was that Tyler did just stay away. He didn't make any moves to contact Jess when she was trying to figure out things with Jeff, Ty just disappeared. I'd have loved to have seen him stay in contact more, keep himself present in Jess's life, but it all works out in the end with a sweet happy ending.

I also really enjoyed Jeff and Rabia's story, especially Rabia. She's such a strong character and tries to do the right thing even when she knows she's putting her life on the line to help this hurt stranger. There is a lot of page time given to Jeff and Rabia's story and I enjoyed getting to know them almost as much as Jess and Tyler. In all of the relationships that Cindy Gerard writes, there's always something sweet and tender that comes across so well on page and that's especially true here for both couples. I think it's what helped me believe in the relationships that Jess and Jeff were building with other people.

Always an exciting moment for me is when I see the names, Nate, Gabe, Johnny Reed, Joe Green (to name a few) show up on page. I love these guys so much, anytime they show up for a mission, I get giddy with excitement. They make up the team that goes out to rescue Jeff and secure Rabia and her father, taking them to safety as well. Not all goes smoothly, of course, and we get to see Crystal and B.J. in action (albeit "in person" on page, but via communications with the team) and they're really the brains that keep their men alive. I wouldn't necessarily call this story a romantic suspense book, as the only action takes place with Jeff's rescue mission, but that scene was action packed and brought a lot of life to the story.

Gerard is an author whose stories I always have an easy time falling into and thoroughly enjoying and The Way Home is no exception. I loved Tyler to pieces and his relationship with Jess was full of heart, heat and love. I was also satisfied with the relationship between Jeff and Jess and where their lives take them post-rescue. You can never go wrong with a story in the Black Ops world and I enjoyed the romances for these two different couples, very much.

I'm a big Cindy Gerard fan so of course I was more than a little excited to read this mash-up connecting her Black Op Inc and One Eyed Jacks characters. Yup, Merry Christmas to me!

Simply put CG is the master of romantic suspense. Her action scenes and exotic locations always drop you right into the thick of it. With proper military jargon and weapons lingo she doesn't stray into OTT territory either. Gerard also excels at writing the tortured hero (I've lost track of how many literary boyfriends this woman has given me) yet still manages to provide comic relief with some serious male bonding and a bromance or two.

The Way Home was no different; it hit all my happy buttons even though I will admit to being slightly put off by the small-town-romancy feel we had going in the beginning. Jess and Tyler's romance was just a little too sweet for me (although lots of people like those Virgin River-ey type reads) However when you pair that aspect up with the events taking place with her presumed dead husband in Afghanistan you've got something special.

I found these two divulging storylines very clever, because as the reader you're watching Jess and Tyler fall in love, healing and learning to love again but you've also got the knowledge that Jess's husband J.T is getting closer and closer to rescue. And with that the whole story flips and becomes more poignant, taking on a level of suspense and heartache, because you know that this just can't end well for anyone.



I loved all of Jeff (J.T's) scenes in Afghanistan, now this is the epitome in a tortured hero, (however more in the literal sense here.) His story is absolutely heartbreaking on so many levels and I give kudos to the amount of research that must have gone into not only head trauma and PTSD but the realistic view we also get of an Afghani woman's life. Rabia was an excellent, well fleshed out heroine and I appreciated learning the little things about her life; regarding her religion, what she's allowed to do (drive), say, how to dress as well as her fear of the Taliban and Americans. Her love scenes were written differently too, more respectful, fade to black. Very much in character.

Ultimately this book was everything I had hoped for; romantic, angst filled and passionate. I seriously didn't know how CG was going to bring these two romances together and make them work. The Way Home tells the story of Ty Brown and Jess Albert who we met in the previous story Killing Time. Ty is Mike's brother and Jess was the war widow that helped the crew out when they needed weapons. Several months later Ty goes back as he never forgot her and it seems she never forgot him, but she was scared to take the risk in having a relationship with another military man as she had lost her husband in Afghanistan nearly four years ago. ### **The set up**

It's been over three years since Jess Albert was widowed when her husband J. R. was killed in action in Afghanistan. While she's moved on with her life, she hasn't done so romantically until Ty Brown suddenly showed up on her doorstep again. She hasn't seen him in the eighteen months since she helped him and his brother one night by supplying them with emergency weapons to take down a master criminal. He promised to come back and see her but never contacted her again. He's there on a leap of faith that there may be something for the two of them to explore.

### **The issues**

Meanwhile, as Jess and Ty move forward and deepen their relationship, a young Afghan woman, Rabia, finds an American soldier along the roadside who is severely injured. She spends the next months nursing him back to health as he also struggles to remember who he is and his past. It is extremely dangerous for Rabia and her family as they can be executed by the Taliban for harboring and aiding an American.

### **What makes this story work REALLY well**

The two situations unfold and are presented in parallel to each other. As Jess finally finds happiness after all this time, her husband is fighting to regain his health and memory and figure out a way home with Rabia's help. It is tragic and at the same time lovely to see them gather strength and deepen these relationships, knowing the heartaches destined ahead. Jess is an incredible woman, self sufficient and independent. Rabia has the same qualities and is even more courageous by being so in the midst of a war and the Taliban who consider women chattel. You want to root for all of them but a happy ending for all seems futile.

There's a level of tension underlying the story, both romantic and dangerous as discovery by the Taliban is a constant threat and J. R.'s inevitable extraction will be problematic considering he's assumed dead by the Americans and still hunted by the Taliban. I had so many mixed emotions from start to end and I didn't want to ever walk away from the story.

### **What was missing**

Absolutely nothing.

### **The bottom line**

Loved the story, the characters and the writing. It's all here...love, pain, tragedy, honor, conflict, courage, humor...and perfectly woven into an extraordinary tale. There are no wasted words or imagery and I easily transitioned from the Afghan village to the Minnesota lakeside at will. I felt like I was witnessing the covert extraction operation, plugged into the action and communications. This is an exciting series and a must read.

I've been a fan of Cindy Gerard since her Bodyguards series. Her name has become synonymous with Romantic Suspense for me. Her books have never failed to keep me at the edge of my seat with suspense, action, and just enough steam to make it even better.

This book was different. But in the case here, it's not necessarily a bad thing. While it was not quite what I had suspected, I enjoyed it immensely. It was a little less on the action and the suspense, and a little more on romance. It was a heartwarming and poignant story about love and second chances. It was, in a word, wonderful.

When Jess lost her husband four years ago, the last thing she expected was to see Tyler Brown again. Lost in a dark emptiness that has become her life's companion, the only thing that Jess feels is empty.

I adored the way that Tyler pursued Jess. He wasn't pushy, he respected her boundaries, but at the same time he knew just what to do to get past them. As much as I wanted to get irritated with Jess at times and the way she seemed to almost push Ty away, I couldn't help but feel for her. I understood her hesitancy, but I loved watching her walls slowly crumble for Tyler.

But then the news that the husband she had thought was killed in action is actually alive, Jess and Tyler's world comes to a crashing halt.

I wasn't quite sure how I would like having a dual story, but Miss Gerard pulled it off seamlessly.

Because of the cover, I almost passed this book. I didn't know it was loosely tied to the BOI and the One-Eyed Jacks series. However, don't let the holiday-themed cover fool you. Yes, there is a holiday vibe to it, but if you read the blurb, you are immediately struck by a heady dose of angst and heartbreak. I thought I was ready for this book. But I never expected it to touch me so deeply.

Cindy Gerard is the master of Romantic Suspense. She simply excels when it comes to writing action-packed scenes that are highly detailed and infused with passion and fun. Similarly, her heroes have been some of the hottest in RS that I've read, so why then did I expect a different vibe to this story?

Well, there actually is a different vibe to it. There are highly detailed and often tragic scenes of the action,

but Gerard also further explores the angst that has been so popular in stories today. Jess is a sweetheart heroine. Her husband was killed in Afghanistan four years ago. Since then, she hasn't lived for herself, instead busying herself with running the shop and generally avoiding anything that involved emotions. For too long, she hurt and I could understand her need to distance herself from that.

It isn't until Ty Brown, a former military person himself, returns to explore the ember of chemistry he sensed when he first met Jess. Though cautious at first, their romance soon blooms into something magical under the gentle care of this alpha male.

But it isn't suddenly a happily ever after for these two because soon Jess learns that her husband, J.R. or Jeff is actually alive. He suffers from reterograde amnesia which means he doesn't remember events, even those from his past. In fact, he has no idea that he has a wife back home waiting for him.

As Jeff recovers as much as a warrior can, he is aided by Rabia, an Afghani woman hiding from the Taliban. Just as Ty and Jess's romance festers slowly, Jess and Rabia also discover a meeting of hearts in this dark time. As you can expect, there is a ton of angst, but it makes this book so much more heartfelt and moving. I questioned how I would feel about the two couples: How would Gerard fit two romances in one book? Would it be potent enough? Would it be too much? Would I care about one couple more than the other?

Honestly, the whole thing exceeded my expectations. Gerard's writing has always been fabulous, but I think this book might be my favourite story she has ever written.
