True love knows NO boundaries! Lila wrote an amazingly, hot, erotic story of how a couple came to be and what the husband will go through just to make his wife happy. This book is an excellent example of how the BDSM lifestyle is used to fill a void, satisfy ones craving and bring people together. Even if one is new to the scene. It's also the first book I've read that has two Doms and one Sub instead of the usual two Subs and one Dom. I found it very intriguing!

Tori has been in the scene for many years. She's frequented club Vertigo for that long with her good friend JC. One night she sees a man the stands out of the crowd like a sore thumb. Not even dressed appropriately for the club or the scene. She sees him there more and more and he always has his eyes on her (and only her). He repeats to her that "one day she will be his wife", but she has needs that he cannot satisfy. On a slight turn of events she gives him a chance.

Chad is one rich dude! He has secrets and desires. But what he desires the moment he spots Tori in Vertigo is her and only her. He is not personally into the scene, mainly a voyeur. But is willing to do what it takes to get Tori to be his and keep her happy. He takes some time throughout their relationship to learn and investigate ways to bring Tori what she needs. He arranges training for himself and a surprise for Tori with Ren (a friend that is a Dom in the scene and recently found out about Chad and Tori's arrangement). Ren is intrigued and works with Chad to help him be the Dom Tori needs and more.

Chad is an amazing man to do all he does for Tori. Once all the pieces fall into place there are not just two happy content people, but three as a whole. Complete and one as a unit of three. Loved it!

Dom and sub find another Dom to complete them. Some sweet and sexy bdsm scenes, but also trite brand and wealth dropping.

Torn between 2 and 3 stars for this one.

I like the concept and can see the potential, but the execution had problems. There's a lot of info dumping

and mostly telling instead of showing, not to mention the brand name dropping on almost every page. Actually, that may make me give this 2 stars, it was that annoying and distracting and poorly done. You're trying to describe a rich young prepster who has style and class, and you put him in Ed Hardy? And the heroine's repeated pondering of how much she loves her husband's fragrance, Clive Christian No. 1, but no explanation of why -- because it reminds her of him? because she's fond of powdery orientals? because it's ridiculously overpriced and fits the character sketch?

And that's the main problem I had: the author throws out those little details but there's no emotion to ground them. At the end of the story I have no more idea of who the characters are than I did at the beginning. So the big sex scene that most of the story builds up to? Boring. Mechanical. So didn't care.

This was a nice story. Definitely middle of the road for me.

We have Tori, who had a rough time growing up, who is a submissive. And Chad, a silver-spoon heir, who stumbled upon the BDSM club Tori frequents and pretty much immediately falls in love. Turns out he's dominant, though he doesn't initially show it. Tori doesn't think Chad can really give her what she needs as a submissive, so she sort of torments him by constantly letting other Doms take her away for sessions in the club. But Chad keeps returning. Finally, he gets involved in the play, but he can't inflict the pain Tori feels she needs. Tori also tries to push Chad away because she feels like she won't fit into his world, that she's socially beneath him. Somehow, Chad convinces Tori to marry him with the understanding that he can't live the lifestyle because of who he is, but they'll play three special nights a year. For the most part, it works for them, though Tori would really like more. She loves Chad and understands why it has to be this way.

But Chad has come up with a very special present for their anniversary. Sneaky boy, Chad. Sneaky and creative, too. I suppose it's a little easier to be creative when you're loaded, lol. And we learn why Chad can't inflict the pain, and while his reason is understandable, I'm not sure why it took him several years to tell her. I think it was quite presumptuous on the part of Chad to find someone to add to their relationship on a permanent basis seemingly without talking to Tori about it. It also seemed unrealistic that Ren could love Tori (and vice versa) when they hadn't really spent that much time together. Attraction or strong lust? Sure, but love? Then again, I guess it didn't seem like Chad got to know Tori that well beyond the club (because she wouldn't let him) before proposing marriage, so maybe that's just how this group rolls.

Since I'm not really into the pain aspect of BDSM, the scenes were just okay for me. I think because of all the insta-love, it was hard for me to "feel" what these three people apparently felt for each other. But it was still an enjoyable story.
