Couple's connection was lacking, but good world building.

The author created a very interesting world building for this science fiction romance. This could be classified as a 'breeder' romance, as the alpha male's home planet had been impacted by a virus that caused the females to become barren. All those males and no females around to mate with. The uniqueness of the book is that the 'aliens' Valdarens are extremely long lived, almost to an immortality length life span i.e. 2,000 yrs is a man still in his prime. What we know of the culture is that despite low birth numbers the population has not had a dramatic decline. I know the virus is supposed to have been a bad thing, but with such longevity; would not over population have been a problem? We that is another story. In this one two warring alien races had crashed on Earth about 2,000 years ago and they influenced Earth's people and society. The author plays fast and loose with the historic timeline, in recounting Earth historical events, as the Pyramids pre date Jesus' time on the Earth. The author also doesn't have a very high opinion of world religions as seen through alien eyes. Neither of these points affected my enjoyment of the book.

The major draw back in this book is that I need more interaction on an emotional level between Cari/heroine and Scandon/hero. It was almost all physical attraction as they were destined mates. Biological drive to mate is fine, but I need a emotional connection; one scene prior to the lust filled nooky was needed.

The story started out rough, the plot slow going, the wording stilted, more telling than showing and the characters hard to connect with, especially in the sample that amazon makes available. I read that sample several times before I decided that the book was cheaper than the iced coffee I got the other day and just bought it. Because this appears to be the author's first released book and since many similar writers that I've found also started as indies or small press, I wanted to give the story a chance and continued to read.

I really wanted to like this book but it's just too frustrating.

Where do I start..

1. I really liked the premise but the first part of the book read like a really bad ya novel. Cari acts and talks like a teenager. She has supposedly been raised around the world so, imho, she should sound more cultured. Not walking around in a Wal-Mart in awe. Point of fact: If I was 400+ years old I don't think I would even think of someone that young romantically(in the Valendendran society). Just saying. An example of good use of age difference is in Vampire books like the ones Lynsay Sands writes; thousands of year old Vamps with young adult women (mid20s +) who act like young adult women.

It really bothered me that Cari basically forgot about her until someone brought up how fast she was healing, and then going on to laugh and joke about her new anklets while her friend who is probably being tortured and *um hello* raped??
