The series continues and this time it's with Cashel and Justice.

Justice became Alpha after his father died from a spider bite but he inherited a pack struggling to survive, lack of water had forced them to introduce a one child per couple policy which was strictly enforced.

His father's last words:

"When our people are at their most desperate the source will be revealed.".....

"And our people will be saved...".....

"I have searched all my life," his father rasped, "and failed. Now, Son, the task is yours."

So no pressure then?

Cashel is an Omega and an embarrassment to his father the unbelievably cruel and evil Darius. Darius is desperate to get Cashel pregnant to the extent he's allowed his body to be changed and distorted so Cashel can no longer eat or drink normally. His life is one of suffering and loneliness and even though we're thankfully spared the details it still makes difficult reading.

Failed attempt after failed attempt to get him pregnant has resulted in severe injuries and just added to Cashel's misery. Now his father has decided the winner of the games will impregnate his son and so he drags Cashel along with him.

Justice is a competitor in the games and his plan had been to kill the Alpha's son until he realises he's his mate.

This is another addictive read which I struggled to put down my only issue was I didn't feel the connection between Cashel and Justice to the same extent I have with the previous two. I understand why they didn't spend much time together but it made the relationship building difficult.

I'm really enjoying this series and the harsh, cruel world that's been created here and now I'm just waiting for the next one.....

It's so common in popular series that the first or second books are really good and well constructed and it goes downhill after that but it's not the case with this series. There are currently 3 books in the series and I love every single book for different reasons. Plus, although they are in a series, you don't necessarily need to read from book 1 since they are enjoyable as standalone. So for those of you who don't wanna invest their time in the whole series, choose your pick. Whichever book you pick up from the series, you'll love it.

So we have two MCs here as usual, Justice and Cashel. Justice is an unmated alpha from the desert lands of Arrides. Criminals and bad people are usually sent to Arrides as punishment. What people don't know is that there is a whole secret settlement of wolf and human hybrids in the desert. Justice has to do something quick because the desert can no longer supply enough resources to his people and he has no choice but to come to mainland for the better chance of survival for himself and for his whole pack.

Cashel is technically the alpha heir of his father but unfortunately he was born as an Omega and that's unheard of since the first born sons of alphas are always born alpha. He was abused, tortured and technically raped by many other alphas by the consent of his father as an attempt to impregnate him and make him heavy with pups.

Justice's plan was simple. Since he couldn't surrender himself at the hands of very cruel territorial alpha (who is Cashel's father), he decided to kill both the alpha and his son and take over the territory. But all unexpected things happened when he realized the very person whom he was supposed to kill, Cashel, was his fated mate.

I really loved how the broken, fractured and abused Cashel was rescued and enamored by our all macho alpha Justice. This novel feels like a fairytale. A desperate maiden locked away in a tower and a Prince Charming come galloping on a white horse (btw, Justice's stallion IS white! ?) and rescue the damsel in distress. When I had read the last book of that series, I had a depressing rest of the week. I couldn't make myself part from the characters and think about looking for a similarly great series by another author. So you can well imagine my delight and anticipation when I heard about the first book of this series, The Alpha King.

After reading it, and then The Alpha Heir, and now The Alpha Prince, I am ecstatic to say that I shouldn't have feared anything. Michael Pauley did a fantastic job with the audio of this story. I loved the different voices he used for each character. He brought the story back to life in my mind and made me love it all over again.

Oh my, how I love this series!

The stories in this series just keep getting better and better. The books are connected and yet I think they also stand-alone very well. For maximum enjoyment, though, I'd recommend reading them in order.

Justice is the Alpha of his pack. He has sworn to give his people a new place to live where food and water are plentiful. He and his pack will kill the evil Alpha Darius and move to his lands.

Cashel is the son of Alpha Darius and he is an omega. Darius is furious that Cashel wasn't born an alpha therefore he has no heir. It's become Darius's obsession that Cashel's body should be altered so he can birth a pup to carry on their line.

I've said it before; Victoria Sue like to torture her "boys" but she always gives them an HEA. While no rape actually happens in this story, there are scenes where it nearly happens to Cashel. There are also fairly graphic depictions of fights; lots of blood. While I don't necessarily enjoy reading those things, they are integral to the story and not just gratuitously thrown in for shock value.

Once again, Victoria Sue's wonderful prose had my emotions all over the place. I laughed and cried and felt lots of things in between the laughter and tears.

I did a beta read of this story for the author and hated putting it down to take care of things in real life.

Told in a dual POV, this was brutal to listen to at first. I mean that literally - Cashel, an Omega born to a brutal dictator Alpha has been beaten, tortured, and experimented on. When his father, the Alpha of Solonara - Darius, sets out a series of games with the winner getting Cashel to breed we meet Cashel's mate, Justice and the stakes have never been higher.

Michael Pauley takes over narration duties from Joel Leslie, who voiced the first two books in the Kingdom of Askara series, and **I thought he did a terrific job**. Strong character voices, a great grasp of adding emotion to the scenes and good timing set up this audio to break your heart and then slowly give you hope.

Victoria Sue is the Queen of putting her characters through hell and back, but making sure they always come out the other side. Maybe a bit battered for it all, but stronger definitely for it. *The Alpha Prince* does contain some pretty graphic descriptions of torture, but there are also threads of hurt/comfort, with good character development, and a really good pace. **The happy ending here is hard won, with plenty of action taking place, and plenty of gasp!worthy moments.**

While *The Alpha Prince* is the third installment in the series, it actually runs concurrently with books one and two *The Alpha King* and *The Alpha Heir*, so it could be read as a standalone, however, I think as a listener you'll get more pleasure if you've listened to the others before starting.

If you aren't reading this series you really HAVE to read this series. This is book three in Victoria Sue's Kingdom of Askara series. The big question everyone always asks, "Is it a standalone?" I'll answer that first. You can technically read this as a standalone but there are mention of past things and there are also visits from past characters. Though it doesn't alter your book experience it's neat to know who they all are.

The Alpha Prince will tug at your heart just as much as the other two. There's a dark element to it but I will say it wasn't as soul twisting as The Alpha Heir. But still, I almost shattered my Kindle a few times. The emotions are high and there's parts that literally make you ache. But Victoria always pushes the depths of every emotion in all her books.

This one is an MPreg, like book one, and there's such a twisted situation going on for Cashel in this story. The life he's led that brought him face to face with Justice. Cashel's father wins worst parent in all of everything. I wanted him to die a billion times. He was never going to be a redeemable character and you are supposed to hate him. But when you're reading a parent that is awful there's a lingering hope in every reader that it will be made right.... Nope not here folks feel free to let your hate flag fly with this monster.

Justice, though he irritated me a couple times with his doubting Cashel, he truly IS justice. His name is his

birthright in a sense. He's strength and power and righteousness. And even though I got frustrated with him a few times he was everything Cashel needed.

ETA: OK, I've had some sleep and some time to process this and I've been thinking - what's my favorite story of the series so far? And I don't think I can still answer that!

I love the world building in this series, how each book is set in a different area and you can really see the differences in the world and what's going around, with how the humans are treated, to how the ruling wolves are and just how ruthless they are in how they rule.

For fans of hurt/comfort, I think you will really eat this one up - Cashel has been treated like dirt - LOWER than dirt, really - ever since he presented as an omega. The things that his father put him through made me cringe and want to cry for him, it was just too much. But Justice - ahhhhh Justice, a wonderful, strong, compassionate, alpha who is the perfect match for Cashel after he gets over his stupid notion of doing what's "best" for Cashel at his own expense. Yep, hurt/comfort is strong with this one, and I just adored it.

As with the previous installment, this one follows the same general path. It is set in the same world, but rather than a continuation, it is a tale of a different area of Askara. It could be read on it's own, but I definitely recommend starting with book 1 in order to get all the details and history learned from starting at the beginning. I should also note that while there is an mpreg theme throughout this series, it plays a more substantial role in this book, as it did in book 1.

Cashel is an Omega, which, as we have learned, usually have special abilities and are to be cherished. Unfortunately, he has not had that kind of life. His evil, greedy, power hungry alpha father cares little for Cashel, aside from the belief that he can produce an heir. He has put Cashel through unimaginable horrors by having healers try to alter his body so he could reproduce. He was experimented on, forced to endure pain, forbidden to shift, given to countless males in attempts to impregnate him, etc. In a last ditch effort, his father has called for an open tournament, the winner gets to breed Cashel as the prize.

Meanwhile, Justice is following his own path to lead his people to a better life, as their land is running dry on resources. By doing that, he plans to kill the Alpha and the Alpha Prince gaining entry by entering the tournament, taking over as Alpha. Plans chance when he sees the Alpha Prince and how he is treated. He knows something isn't right, that he isn't the cruel man his father is, and above all, recognizes him as his mate.

This is a fabulous series. There are many details that come into play about the land, the people, the ancestry, etc. Ms. Sue manages to make each story feel fresh while at the same time bringing us back to the same interesting place. This story ends similarly to the last in that the Alpha King and his Omega, Luca and Kit from book 1, make an appearance tying everything together. This series feels a little like pulling strings to

form a knot. Each story is a side string, but they feel as though they are being joined together to make one bow in the end. Perhaps there are more strings to come or there will be a final book bringing everything together for a finale – I can only imagine and hope there is more to come and definitely recommend you give this series a try.
