Each section is short, to the point and uses language which is accessible but not patronising. Bad points: Should one decide to pursue anything which captures their interest, they will unlikely be pointed in the right direction by the book. The bibliography is sparse. Anybody who has knowledge of or more than a passing interest in psychology won't learn anything new here. It is very introductory.
