It was exhausting after the first couple of times so I kept skipping the sex scenes which incidentally meant I skipped over 75% of the book.

I initially thought the introduction of Remy would act as a disruption to all that sex but he rather further jumbled it. This is a hard review to write as I enjoyed the overall story but it struggled to keep my attention. We meet Vance who is a vampire hunter and gets sent to move on/kill the yet another from the Louisiana Swamps. There he meets Clay, a vampire but someone he has an instant connection to and can't seem to keep away from. The two men begin a scorching affair with assist on occasion from Remy, Clay's friend and donor. However, Vance has failed at his job and his boss is none too happy about it and in order to keep them all alive they have to do something about it and Gryphon, the other vampire they collect along the way. The characters we meet are all fun to read, and hot, especially when it comes to the intimate moments together, of which there are many! The interactions between Vance and Remy are especially funny as they snipe and snark at each other.

The story line overall for me was interesting with a vampire hunter falling for the vampire he's sent to kill and then the boss man being none to happy about it. What I struggled with, I think, was the writing style with short, sharp sentences often with incomplete thoughts or conversations so I had to really pay attention to where things were heading. As an erotic book, you'd expect a lot of sex and it wasn't the amount that became frustrating but how it deviated an important moment or conversation. The coming together of the boss man and Vance felt slightly anticlimactic as well, after the amount of time that was spent building up to it. Our main focus is on Vance and Clay but we do also hear from Remy and Gryphon's POV which is interesting and mixes things up a bit throughout the book. It gives us a chance to see things outside of the relationship that's heating up the pages and helps to understand a bit more of what's going on and I loved seeing Remy get some attention that he deserved. Remy's Louisiana dialogue is brilliant, I can hear the accent in my head as reading the words he's speaking.

BA Tortuga is one of my favorite writers in this genre and this book doesn't let me down.

The premise caught my eye. I loved the idea of a hunter who sees the error of his ways when he gets to know his prey. The glimpses we get inside of Clay's head reveal a man who does his job because it gets him paid but he really has no love of what he does.

Vance is everything a vampire should be. Sexy and dangerous, full of passion and when you mess with what's his, you're gonna get the fangs.

The setting for the story is wonderful. For me, down in the bayou is the perfect place for Clay and Vance to get to know each other better. Remy is a sweetheart, with a steel spine, willing to do whatever he has to so he can take care of the people he cares about. I love his "you gotta do what you gotta do" attitude. But he's

sweet in funny ways and I can almost hear his Cajun accent in my head.

Gryphon is another character that I had no trouble picturing. His age leaves him a little less human than Vance and there's no trouble seeing that the farther a vampire comes from his making, the less he will bother to fit into societies constraints.

He once was a successful undercover police officer for about 10 years, until one day his cover was blown, and he was tortured, scarred and put on leave of absence. Instead of eventually going back to the force, he is now a Vampire Bounty Hunter. He doesn't ask questions, he just does his job. Without feelings or remorse.

When Vance is asked to relocate the mysterious Vampire, Clay, out of Shreveport he reluctantly agrees to do so. Vance is tired and seriously considering possibly quitting being a hunter, but he finds himself hunting down Clay despite his reservations. Vance's plans backfire when the hunter becomes the hunted and Clay ends capturing Vance instead.

Clay can't believe he is being hunted down by a bounty hunter and asked to move from his home. He doesn't hurt anyone. He only takes what he needs and doesn't see why he has to move. He also doesn't understand why he is so enraptured with the angry, scarred man. But, the more Clay and Vance are around each other, the more they are drawn to one another. Despite their differences, Clay and Vance soon become intimate and become inseparable. When Vance's boss realises that Vance has been "Compromised" he sends out an assassin to kill both Vance and Clay. Now they must work to stay alive, while exploring their new feelings for one another.

I liked this book. I thought that both Vance and Clay were interesting characters. I liked both of them, and it was easy to understand why they were so taken with one another. There is a secondary romance between Clay's assistant, Remy, and another vampire, Gryphon, that I actually liked better than Clay and Vance's story, (whoops..I am sure that wasn't supposed to happen...lol)
