In this book, a young girl helps a leprechaun named Roy G. Biv find his rainbow. It can be used for science to teach about the colors of the rainbow and it can be used during the St. Patrick's Day season.

This is a cute book to read in March near St. Patrick's Day or when you are trying to teach children about the colors in a rainbow. Drawn from Irish folklore, in which leprechauns are associated with rainbows, this story is a unique addition to the celebration of this holiday. A little girl becomes concerned that her grandfather won't be able to play his bagpipes when rain threatens to cancel a St. Patrick's Day parade. As she stands outside with her yellow umbrella, she meets a leprechaun who snatches the red licorice that her grandfather gave her to begin to make his rainbow. He enlists her help to continue building it to bring the sun out and save the parade. For every color, he needs something that belongs to her. For something green he asks her to sacrifice her precious green penny whistle that was also a gift from her grandfather.

I love the strong familial connection between the grandfather and granddaughter as well as the fact that both are acquainted with this particular leprechaun. This book teaches children the colors of the rainbow as the leprechaun himself is named Roy G. Biv. The end of the book also contains factual information about the science of rainbows and explains the Roy G. Biv abbreviation as well as giving information about how people have used rainbows to create stories.

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### **Sarah says**

This is a cute book that shows how the leprechaun creates his own rainbow. For some reason this book scared my daughter and we only read it twice. There isn't anything scary, but I don't think she liked the leprechaun taking things from the little girl to create his rainbow. :)
