Did you think I stood a chance in *Wish I May*? Nope...not even close. And it wasn't just the stuff he would say, which trust me...was pretty fantabulous – but it was the little things. He is the quintessential nice guy – he went above and beyond to do whatever Cally might need and all because he loved her. Never stopped.

So my poor sweet Cally...so many ways I hurt for her. She comes back to New Hope to bring her sisters to live with their dad...and in doing that, she brings back all the history of her past. Or really...her mom's past...a stigma that she is now plagued with and never wants to live up to. She is her own worst enemy in this book...which is partly due to the ghosts of her mother and also her past that haunts her and why she won't allow herself to be free. Not only is she plagued with her decisions but she's also hiding behind them. It was a little frustrating because up until the end of the book, you do not know the *entire* truth. You are fed bits and pieces but it was a **good** kind of frustrating...you want to pull your hair out, but you're enjoying it the entire time.

"Unbreak Me" was an amazing book and I completely fell in love with the characters so when I heard William was getting his own book, I was beyond excited. "Wish I may" tells the story of William and Cally and can be read as a standalone although for me, it was nice to reconnect with Asher and Maggie and see where their lives had taken them but also, I wanted to see William finally get his HEA... but would he? I mean his track record with the ladies had so far been dire.

Cally had never had the best life but leaving New Hope at sixteen unfortunately resulted in it getting a whole lot worse. The sacrifices this girl made to ensure there was a roof over her siblings heads and food in their belly were just horrific. Although this is book #2 in the "New Hope Series," it could be read as a standalone as Lexi Ryan gives the reader just enough background information to make the necessary connections between "Unbreak Me" and "Wish I May" without feeling like they've been reading two separate books or that they're missing vital parts of the puzzle.

I have rated "Wish I May" 4 - 4.5 Hearts. (4 hearts for the first half and 4.5 for the second half).
