Even though Bobby was off the streets now, working in a club serving drinks, Danny and Tiernan needed someone to help them learn the ropes; know where to go, who to talk to, what to do.... So, Danny thought of Bobby. He was a little hesitant at first, but as someone who was a victim of the murderer who just barely escaped with his life, he agreed to help them out. He took Bobby to his neck of the woods, introduced him to his pimp and they made a really good team, working together.

Of course, the more time they spent together, the more attracted they were to each other.
