After the gig Dylan disappears and an adventurous goose chase for Nicole begins. This mini novel introduces us to Portia Macintosh's main character Nicola Wilde and the rockstar in question Dylan King. We're told that the author has enjoyed a similar rock n roll lifestyle to Nicola, after she fell in with a bunch of 'rockstars' at 15 years old and then "landed a job in the music industry". We're told Portia now wants to "spill the beans" and "share her secrets" through writing novels based on these events, and Nicola is obviously a semi autobiographical character (and is Portia a pen-name?) as a music journo hanging out 'with the band'.

Now, if this was any other sphere, I'd probably be uninterested in this kiss and not quite tell style, but as a massive music fan, I was quite intrigued, and as Portia very kindly offered me this, and her full length novel featuring the same characters 'How Not to be Starstruck', as free e-books I thought I'd give it a go and provide a balanced and honest review (one of the first I've ever written!)

'Rock Star' takes us on a whirlwind tour of various locations, focussing on a hotel, following Nicola and her handsome celebrity mate Troy Reeves trying to find her naughty rock star best bud Dylan King so he doesn't miss a charity gig. On the way, there's a tattoo parlour, a hippy shop, a haunted hotel floor and a red light district, and a growing number of Dylan's conquests.

Nicola starts off on her quest on her own and seems totally focussed on finding Dylan, but during the journey she gets reminded that she deserves a little fun herself. The story is a quick paced fantasy: living the party life style without too much thought about the consequences, what people think or every day, mundane responsibilities. This element did appeal to me, as I do like a few bevies, live bands and music festivals, it's just a shame I've got to go back to the office job afterwards!

There was some good humour featured (a bit of Bart Simpson style punnery for example) and lots of modern cultural references that will make it quite accessible for people who want an easy read, want a holiday read or a bit of fun escapism without having to tax their brains too much.

The thing that irritated me a bit was the lead character was a bit down on her fellow woman, and especially

when they were a bit different or alternative. The character didn't appreciate being labelled as a "festival person" but she was ok to put labels on other people, eg "goth" and "hippy". Although Nicola comes over as a party animal she got a bit squeamish and/or judgemental over tattoo parlours and drugs. Nicola described herself as a "girly girl" and as taking on 'typical female' roles when going on tour with the band which I felt was a bit disappointing, although this is balanced with enough bad behaviour of her own to still be entertaining.

Saying that I read the book and have started the next follow on, full length novel, to see what else Nicola gets up to.

Nicole Wiled has been best friends with mega-star Dylan King, since she was just starting out as a music journalist, and he tried to seduce her. There's plenty of perks, but when said rockstar, gorgeous lead singer of the Burnouts, has zero sense of self preservation, things are tricky. Once he's got a drop of alcohol in his system, Dylan only thinks about Little Dylan in his pants, and seeing as he's perpetually drunk, minding him is a full time job.

Nicole is at a day festival reporting on the bands performing, once of which being The Burnouts. Dylan left the stage in a hurry, drunk, and has been missing ever since. Dylan's tour manager Claire, has had enough, and insists that he's Nicole's problem, as she's the only one he listens to. Nicole has until 6pm the next day to track Dylan down, and get him on the tour bus so they can make the charity gig they're scheduled to perform.

Luckily for Nicole, she bumps in to Troy, a reality TV star who was also performing at the festival, and who decides to tag along and help her for an adventure. Together they have to face an abundance of groupies, a haunted hotel, a very dodgy tattoo parlor, an angry prostitute, a mellow hippy, and follow Dylan's activities of the night which appear to have involved a lot of bed hopping and no sleep. Not to mention a Transvestite. Will she be able to find him in time? Will she get to have some fun with Troy? When she completes her mission does she go home? Or should she hop on the tour bus for more fun?
