Although Hazel has a bunch of revelations of herself, there is a lot to be annoyed about her character: Jamie's more honest to herself and others of her faults. Clarice, Maureen and Jameson had much more to their personalities as well. To be fair, there is a quit a time gap between release of the very first strip and the 600th, but it took a time to deliver a comic that I start actually to like at some level.
