First things first: **A PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENT:**

This is a BDSM book (in a BDSM trilogy), thus it inherently contains scenes that will make many readers uncomfortable, but this one *needed* a damn disclaimer! I read a lot of erotica and BDSM, I love it. So I know what to expect... what I did NOT expect was a scene where a sub is assaulted and raped. So if you are sensitive to that subject, are a survivor, or the loved one of a survivor—like I am—than you should know that such a scene lays ahead when you begin reading this book. Heaven forbid you be surprised and traumatized because there's no disclaimer.

Speaking of, **WHY THE F*CK WASN'T THERE A DISCLAIMER *ANYWHERE* ON/IN THIS BOOK!?** How many people read a book before it goes to publishing? Yet NO ONE thought this warranted a goddamn disclaimer!??

Are you kidding me!?

Now, with the important stuff out of the way, onto the actual review: I LOVE HEA do-overs! You know perfect marriage hits the rocks or experiences some sort of trauma and then it's '*all in & balls out*' to save it. LOVE those!! And you know from the first few pages of book one that Chessy & Tate's story is going to be that.

Chessy has been unhappy for far too long—seriously—she waits YEARS to mention her misery to her once-dating husband? Speaking as the partner that usually does the leaving—particularly after staying longer than I should have—I don't get that. I stay MONTHS too long, with the same hope/delusion she had “if I'm patient and understanding things will work themselves out,” but a year is pushing it. Two is ridiculous.

As the last book in the trilogy I had some expectations... and the book fell short on all of them. It is equally as repetitive as the last two; you read the same inner monologues & verbal speeches 2-3x within thirty pages (just in reversed roles). Chessy is utterly spineless. She's in this strange denial-and-pity-party subspace; she whines to her friends and then pleads with them to forget she said anything and not try to help. I know she's submissive, but *I* am submissive, and that's not part of the role. For the entirety of the book I was either annoyed, pissed or horrified (the scene mentioned in the disclaimer).

That scene is traumatizing. Shit, for all intents and purposes she's publicly beaten and ass-raped while screaming and sobbing her safe word. Jensen and Dash remark how badly they want to beat Tate's ass for what happened and goddammit they should have! There's no repercussions for Tate! None.

After that scene it turned into a hate-read. I was so offended and furious I literally felt like I was the one being abused. I don't just mean the way that writers magically transport you into a character, I mean the book violated me. I read a lot of erotica and BDSM and I've yet to come across a scene like that. There are scenes that are disturbing and push boundaries for the sake of character development and moving the story along—sometimes they're necessary, I get that—but that scene didn't do either. It snaps Chessy back to reality, but I'm sure there were ways to do it that stopped shy of sexual assault!

If that wasn't bad enough, shortly thereafter comes my biggest romance-genre pet-peeve. Everything's going to hell, but _____ will fix everything! Ugh. As the last book in a trilogy/series you expect everything to be wrapped up & everyone happy upon completion, and it is—it's just not as satisfying as you'd hoped it be after trudging through all the shit you do in those 3 books. The wrap-up was very detached, generic and just unfulfilling. You get done reading those few pages and literally go "That's it?! Seriously!?"
