Extremely likable characters, relatable. Everything that happens within this story is within the realm of possibility. For that, I consider this a superior contemporary romance. In addition, the genuine emotion the story inspired makes it a better than average romance! Much of the plot involves the child (Nick) that Wes and Sage gave up for adoption when they were teens. This was something they were, in a sense, forced to do. Forced by Sage's father, who is something of a tyrant and was a financial powerhouse in their small town. Clearly I had some issues with the fathers role. However, at times I also took issue with Gabby's best friend role. I felt the ladies would play things a little too coy. The old "I've said too much" this is frustrating in daily life and as a writing technic. Either the character serves a purpose to reveal or doesn't serve a purpose at all. I'm not a fan of half measures. How the story unravels is natural. It has a good and even flow. I feel like I am being given the insight into a subject matter I cannot understand on my own- what it's like to give up a child. It's a heartbreaking situation I wanted greater insight into. I love how we are given the emotions of both mother and father. I devoured this book so I would know what happens to these couples.

The way the story is written is beautiful. Here is an example,

"I got the feeling she didn't want to talk about the past," he admitted, running his thumb over his life line. He did that sometimes to remind himself that even though he'd made a lot of mistakes, he had time left to make things right."

There is great beauty in this book, don't let it pass you by. Although we do get several points of view, the story is largely driven and told by Wes. I valued his POV and could appreciate the frustration he experienced throughout his journey. He was never hateful or inappropriately angry. There are situations and feelings I would not have considered, such as, Wes is unsure Sage ever loved him because she gave up his baby. Wes

finding out Sage's love for him had everything to do with why she went through with the adoption was a devastating reveal for us both. (Look here, another tear just plopped on the screen as I am thinking back on it.) Wes had me rooting for him and his chance at peace and happiness. I feel a sense of fulfillment after reading this journey and as though I have taken a spiritual journey along with these new book friends. Such an amazing story.
