I really enjoyed this one. I thought the premise sounded cute, but to be honest I didn't have the highest expectations. I knew it was a Christian fiction, which sometimes tend to be overly preachy for my taste. So, I was pleasantly surprised by just how much I liked this one. I thought it was really well written, with very likable characters.

Meredith was a fun leading lady. She is feisty, stubborn and kind. She is also fearless and honorable. It was endearing to see her ride onto the Archer ranch knowing she wouldn't be welcome, but knowing she had to warn them. Surrounded by four burly men didn't scare her off, she held her own. I just loved the Archer men. Travis of course was awesome, but I especially loved Crockett. I loved the relationship with the brothers and their loyalty to one another. Travis was a doll; I loved how he was just crazy about Meredith right from the beginning. His attempts to court Meredith were endearing and sweet.
