Bill Peet has done it again with both the illustrations and the writing. Also, Bill Peet shows that

Bill Peet's illustrations are beautiful and realistic, especially of the image of the elephant looking like a wise person as he has wrinkles all over his body and has a friendly expression on his face. I also love the way that Bill Peet illustrates the jungle as a colorful place full of green trees and even some orange sand for images of the wastelands.

"The Ant and the Elephant" is a great tale about the importance of true friendship and kindness and the consequences of acting so arrogant towards people in need of help. I would recommend this book to children ages five and up since the format is easy for them to read.
