This is worth it if (1) you're into world-building and (2) you have read any of the Life Prison and Eternal Dungeon series, preferably some of both. There aren't that many new details, it feels more like a thought experiment. But I find myself thinking about this story surprisingly often, so clearly it did make the world more interesting. This story doesn't try for the kind of soul-flipping emotional richness that I love so much about Peterson's other work, especially *The Eternal Dungeon* or *Waterman: a Turn-of-the-Century Toughs* omnibus of historical fantasy and retrofuture science fiction.
