I cannot think of how many good things I can say about this author's book. The emotions that pour from the pages of the book really grab you and make you want to continue until the end. The mystery behind why Cade really left town to begin with, the reason there was a feud between Cade and Piper's family, and the immediate sexual tension between Cade and Piper... where do you begin?

Piper finds out she has been left part ownership in the store with Cade but Cade is NOT happy. Cade has finally come back home after 12 years gone from his home town. He left because of something very personal and painful. He is back to face some private demons and to take ownership in what he believes is his store, not have to fight Piper for his rightful ownership in the store.

Piper and Cade were at odds over things but the sexual heat between them and the feelings that did develop caused some other bumps down the road. Piper and Cade were a wonderful couple- people who had been hurt in the past and were afraid to open up – I loved seeing them open up to each other. This is the second book in the Donovan Brothers series and this time it is Cade's turn. This former marine turned Montana rancher finds himself back in his small home town. He left twelve years before when he left a pregnant Lonnie at the altar after finding out the child wasn't his. The only problem is that the gossiping town still doesn't know that information.

Piper is shocked when she finds out Cade's grandpa has included her in his will and now co owns the store with Cade. This is a big issue as Piper and her mother have had an ongoing feud with the Donovan's ever since the grandpa had one Piper's family's grocery store in a poker game. These two enemies struggle working together not only because of the feud but because of the scorching chemistry evident between the pair. The feud isn't their only issue though as Piper was Lonnie's best friend.

This book is very similar to the first in the series in that it is a coming home book. The hero and heroine are at odds with each other and they are both doing what they think is best for their families.

There were just a few issues keeping it from a five star read and the main one is that the reason Cade

commits to Piper is a little to close to why he had a bride at the altar a first time. The fact they were even in that situation was too irresponsible for me to condone. Top it off with the lack of true substance bringing the couple together. We get glimpses of something more than love but it wasn't enough for me.

Aside from that it is a sweet quick read you can breeze through in a few hours. Though part of a series it is easily read as a stand alone and it comes with a HEA and a promise of yet another Donovan brother story to come.

As much as I loved the first book, and as much as I wanted to love this one, unfortunately I can't say that it impressed me. I'm a big fan of bickering love. I love the tension that it builds, later that tension leading to passion and finally to reluctant love. I'm sad to say this, but I saw none of that in this book.

Cade is a Marine-turned-rancher who comes back to his hometown to take care of business after his grandfather's death. He avoids his hometown like the plague because that's where his abusive father lives- though his father had been dealt with in the previous book and now everyone knows what kind of scumbag he is- and also because he's left a pregnant woman at the altar and the whole town seems like they shunned him. Piper is a long time resident, but she has her own reasons for avoiding people, mainly because she's already left two men at the altar herself, and now dubbed as the 'Runaway Bride' of town. Add to that the feud between their families and the gossip mill, and you've got the whole story.

Even talking about the plot makes me sad because it had so much potential to be great. Not only there's my beloved bickering love, but also a small town and two fighting families whose two members who are about to fall in love.

In the previous book, the hero had a military background and that wasn't involved in the story. The same happened here. Cade was a Marine, but his past had little to do with his present. Although he was a rancher now-and hello, cowboys- we didn't get much from this side of his life either, except for his Stetson he seemed to carry around with him everywhere. And the whole thing with his father-I'm only telling about this here because it was already revealed in the first book- the resentment, the pain of the past, all of it, it was too weak as a plotline. I felt as though it was only given to us to create an obstacle for Cade and Piper to overcome. No depth, no detail. And since I'm a sucker for emotional baggage and how people get over things, this was disappointing. Cade, though as a character he was okay, as a hero he was too weak. He didn't radiate the strength that I like in my heroes. Sure, he was casual and flirty like a cowboy, he had a tough exterior that contained a very emotional man who still struggled with the past he suffered in the hands of his father, but that's all the surface information we get about him. It was as if he was only outlined for the story but never got his details that'd make it all *him*. And naturally I couldn't connect with his character and when he struggled, I couldn't get beyond my reader status to actually feel for him.

Unfortunately the same goes for Piper. She was good as a heroine outline, but there was no depth to her character either. A lot of things about her didn't make sense to me, her leaving two men at the altar for example. I'm a woman, I should be able to relate to her reasoning but I'm never given any, except for the men not making her feel that passion she thinks she needs to get married. That wasn't enough for me as a reason, I

would've preferred something-and I know I keep repeating myself- deeper. I liked that she was ready to fight for Cade, but that alone wasn't enough to complete her character.

Everything that happened in between, the town residents and their behavior towards Cade and Piper, the wrongs and misunderstandings that were supposed to comprise the plot, the family feud, the abusive father and the will, they all felt like they were there to fill in the pages, not to develop the story.

I liked the idea, I liked the *characters* as an idea, every obstacle too, but it lacked the details. While reading, I wanted more, more character development, more confrontation, more interaction, just more from this story as a whole.

Chasing the Runaway Bride is the second book in the *Donovan Brothers* series by author Susan Meier. This installment focuses on the middle brother, Cade Donovan, who piqued my interest with how he left town and moved to Montana, only returning whenever his mother or brothers needed him. When he finds out that his maternal grandfather, Richard Hyatt, left him the grocery store that was supposedly won in a poker game and must now manage it for a year, he's gobsmacked. He's not exactly thrilled at the idea of having to live in the very town that had nothing better to do than gossip about him nor is he looking forward to having to work side-by-side with Piper O'Riley, the daughter of the man his grandfather won the grocery store from.

Piper O'Riley is surprised that the late Richard Hyatt decided half the grocery store would be given to her but she's not one to complain. Getting back half the store is better than nothing and while she's not excited about having to work with Cade, she'll do what she has to. So what if she's attracted to him? She has no intention of being anything more than his co-worker, especially since she still believes he left her pregnant best friend at the altar years ago and has never provided support for the son her best friend claims is his. However, the more time she spends with him, the more she sees that he's not the horrible person the gossip mongers have made him out to be.

Both Cade and Piper have been fodder for the busybodies of their hometown. Their families have their respective supporters and Piper's own mother has gone out of her way to badmouth the Hyatts and the

Donovans. There are also two camps when it comes to Cade's departure all those years ago, one believing he's a scumbag for having abandoned his pregnant bride and their unborn child and for not bothering with child support afterwards and the other speculating that he left because he found out the child in his bride's womb was fathered by someone other than him. On the other hand, Piper is tagged as a runaway bride, having already left two grooms at the altar, making people think she's either crazy or plays around.

It took a while for Piper to grow on me and maybe it's because I knew that her opinion of Cade was based on presumptions. So yes, my sympathies were geared more towards Cade because the guy was funny, nice, charming, and he had a brain to go with the good looks and brawn. When the truth about Cade's runaway groom past finally came out, Piper's reaction felt real because she was both confused but remorseful. Their relationship didn't suddenly shift from mere co-managers to something more. It was gradual but sweet and I finally started liking Piper for Cade. ^.^ These two had chemistry and I enjoyed how one of them would back away only to change their mind later on.

The manner in which the story of Cade and Piper is told made me appreciate it even more, especially when you reach the end of the book. This was a couple that had personal hurdles to overcome and there's a part that had my heart breaking while I was reading it. The last few chapters alone make this book worth reading and I did it in one sitting. I'm going to assume that Devon's story will have him paired up with Barbara Beth aka B.B., but I could be wrong. ^.^ For *Chasing the Runaway Bride*, I'm going to give 4.5 stars, rounded off to five stars for Goodreads, and I recommend that you read the predecessor, *Her Summer with the Marine*, while waiting for the release of this sequel. ♥

He happens to walk in to where Piper is working and sparks fly between them. They don't initially recognise each other and unbeknownst to them, they are going to get way more than they bargained for with their flirtations. Piper is working at the local pharmacy and has strong family ties to Cade's family store, as her grandfather had owned it before he lost it to Cade's grandfather in a wager. For years Pipers family have resented Cade's family, always believing Cade's grandfather stole the shop from them. For years the secret and true nature of that wager has been kept hidden and when Cade's grandfathers will is read, requiring Cade and Piper to run the store together for 1 year or it will be forfeited, he vows to keep the shop in the family, honoring his grandfathers legacy, and to find the truth behind the rumors.

Piper had her reasons for disliking Cade and they ran deeper than the ownership of the corner store. She believed that he left her best friend at the altar and left their baby behind. Because of this, Piper had sworn off marriage and, in the couple of times that she had been engaged and ready to marry, she ran out on her husbands to be, earning herself a reputation as the town runaway bride. Although it took me a while to connect with Piper, I did end up liking her character. She seemed a bit naive and protected by her best friend and family but she did end up standing on her own and maturing. Cade, on the other hand, I connected with immediately and found his character easy to relate to. He had baggage of his own, much more than what he showed on the surface, and I liked how his character grew and developed. When their relationship started
