The author does an incredible job with her worldbuilding here - the book is set about a decade or so after a scientific experiment gone horribly wrong. The world is populated with an assortment of the living and the undead, and apparently, a few thinking undead. Heathens, Thumpers, and the Righteous make up the living, some in underground cultish groups, others not so underground or cultish, but just as deadly. Jenny is alive when we meet her, in a deep and committed relationship with the dangerous Declan, and she hides the secret of her family - her sadistic grandfather and cruel mother were scientists who experimented on her and her brother, Casey, and let loose the zombie plague on the world. Jenny escaped their clutches, but left her brother behind. Now, she's on a hunt to find her brother and make her family pay.
