Allen's care. Before he died he made Allen promise to take his daughter to Utah to be with her Aunt, implying that Holland was younger than she actually was.

For years Holland has been masquerading as a boy to protect herself from the eyes of the Alaskan loggers who might take advantage of a lone girl; but Holland is no longer a little girl and it is time to show the world that she is not a boy anymore either. Allan is thrown through a loop when he discovers that Holland is twenty rather than thirteen as he had thought. His first thought is getting her off of his hand as soon as possible: meaning get her on a plane out of there! Holland however refuses. Everything she owns is in the truck her father left her, including thousands of dollars worth of gold that Allen isn't aware of.

When the truck is stolen Holland and Allen are stranded in Alaska and have to spend more time with each other. Allen and Holland begin to feel the first feelings of attraction, and Allen begins to teach Holland how to become the woman she is inside.
