Author Ashshajuanna has a great story to tell. I rated the book 4.5 stars and rounded it to 5 stars! This is definitely a tear-jerking type of story. Some titles are metaphorically created, but in this case the title is an accurate representation of the actual story. The main character is Hydeia, and this mere child had to deal with situations that we couldn't even imagine. At such an early age, her innocence was ripped away from her as a result of her mother Sharon, a self-centered, callous, heartless drug addict. Her father was not in her life—at least not initially; fortunately for Hydeia, she was surrounded by compassionate and thoughtful people like Marcus, Zelil, Skye, and eventually Julian her father. All Hydeia desired was her mother's love, but her mother's drug-seeking and malicious behavior destroyed that relationship. Hydeia matured rather quickly since she had to provide for herself. On several occasions she had to deal with her mother's constant and frequent encounter with strange men, a life of squalor, verbal abuse, physical assault, and the psychological degradation that comes with such a life.

The story is plausible, and while we take the people in our lives for granted, the narrative points out why we should be grateful for the people that care and love us. The story is a realistic passage into the lives of the less fortunate. This is a young girl that had to deal with being raped by her mother's boyfriend/drug dealer. There are several scenes in the book that will lacerate, tear, and yank your heart away. Here's one of the many examples:

“She'd enjoyed her daily showers in a clean tub and loved the feeling of the plush cotton towel which dried her smooth paper-brown skin. She had a brand new electric toothbrush which Skye provided and Zelil's bed was like sleeping on a cloud compared to that dirty old mattress that rested on her bedroom floor at home. She wore zelil's clothes and was happy to go to school and flaunt them. For the first time, she was happy.”

I'm very thankful for the story because it provided a glimpse into reality. The fact of the matter is this: Verbal abuse and physical abuse exist, and they happen more often than we think. The content of the book is what did it for me; although, the obvious mechanics such as plot fluidity and character development were also present. ***This Thing Called Life was an enlightening experience!***
