The Alyssa who flirts, finds enjoyment in literature and movies, is proud to be an actress and has desires. Which incarnation will become the real Alyssa! Each of us has a Ryan in our lives. That cold, dark, lonely place our mind goes when self-doubt creeps in. When our choices feel wrong and we look to someone else to make decisions. And then, it becomes so much more than decisions this person desires to control. That black place where only the light of a Luke can find us and bring us back into our life as it was meant to be. From the beginning, this book is a long, slow, serious seduction set against that place in hell that Alyssa has lived for years. Her high school boyfriend, Ryan, was with her as she fell into the throes of bulimia and "saved her life." She tells herself this is true because HE tells her that it's true. Ryan has usurped all of her personal responsibility and decision-making. He lives to control her by not allowing her to live. What to eat, when to eat, how to dress, how to serve as his arm candy, orders to stay away from all fats and foods "not good for you" and, worse, to keep you from your future.
