Well we are back in the distant future with the Phoenix brothers and this time the author has surpassed herself. For several books now we have been teased by Nera Darc, treasure hunter, daredevil and all round scary lady! There's one brother though who pushes all her buttons and that's the studious Niklas. He may no longer work at the Institute but he still loves all things rare and the most precious thing to cross his path has to be the beautiful and oh so dangerous Nera! It's just too bad that she constantly one ups him and steals the artefacts Nik and his brothers struggle so hard to find!

Nik has no intention of working for the corrupt Institute again but a fabulous opportunity to journey back to Earth alongside Nera is one he can't turn down. Earth is a barren land, a victim of the violent war that changed the landscape forever and yet the chance to bring back antiquities unites these treasure hunters. Only short visits on the surface are permitted due to the radiation levels but there's more than one kind of danger waiting out there. As Nik and Nera team up they soon discover that Earth is not as uninhabited as they thought and their expedition on the post apocalyptic planet is fraught with danger !

Niklas Phoenix left the Galactic Institute of Historic Preservation on acrimonious terms and took up treasure hunting with his brothers. The Institute has found him, though, and makes him an offer he can't refuse: an expedition to Earth, with Nera Darc also going. Nik has a fascination with Darc he can't get rid of, and he distrusts the Institute enough to join up to see what they are up to. Nera has always found Nik rare and intriguing, but their rivalry and the remnants of her own issues have kept them apart. Finally working together on the expedition, they have the luxury to decide what they mean to each other. But first, they have to survive zombies, giant mutant cats, acid-spitting plants, and internal sabotage.

I loved our protagonists, separately and together. Niklas is, as Nera says, a good man. The two have been tangling since the beginning of the series, and I do recommend reading the first three Phoenix Adventures books before this one for a little more background on them. Niklas makes a great Indiana Jones, scholar and adventurer, and his respect for Nera is evident even while dirty things are happening. I was a little worried Nera's character would get watered down from what I read in earlier books, but Nera Darc continues to be the baddest treasure hunter in the galaxy, with human issues that she's somewhat dealt with, like most of us. She's not completely trapped by her past but it does give her hangups. The way she falls for Nik and opens up to him feels natural, and her protectiveness (while trusting his competence and letting him stand on his own) made me feel all warm and cozy. They make an excellent team.

The villains, however, are shallow. Their motives are believable but not complex, and I believe there are

actual villainous cackles (one of those memories that's too good to check). It's a sharp contrast to the well-developed protagonists.

The action is filmic. Chase scenes, booby traps, sword and gun fights, gladiator rings, it can make your head spin. With all that, I still somehow have a good idea as to the sequence of events. It's more coherent than the majority of action movies I'm familiar with. Everything is consistent and ties together nicely.

It's also fun to see the radioactive world Hackett has built, abounding with monsters, mutants, treasures, and environmental hazards. The horrors are vivid and scary. The ruins of my beloved New York City got me thinking, "Could we really do this to ourselves someday?" We also make stops in savage Mexico and Peru, and I was always curious to see what the team would discover next! I am very burned out on zombies, though. These are well-done and not garden-variety, but they're still zombies.

We've heard a lot about the Terran war and what happened to Earth afterwards so I was really excited for ***Return to Dark Earth***. **The Institute of Historical Preservation is sending a team of treasure hunters to Earth in hopes of finding some amazing artifacts and though Nik has a bad history with the Institute, he can't pass on the opportunity to see Earth.** Nik is a scholar at heart and I loved the slightly nerdy side of him but he's also a great alpha hero! Nik has been fascinated by Nera from the beginning and now that he has a chance to spend time with her he realizes what his feelings really mean.

I was worried how things would go with Nera since I've been conflicted since her first appearance. **On the outside, Nera comes across as brash, selfish, and possibly unethical, but on the inside there's a streak of honor and when it comes to Nik, Nera will do anything to protect him.** With a better understanding of Nera's past, we can see why she's made the choices she has and why she's pushed everyone away. But Nik has found a way through her hard shell and though trust is hard, they find a way to trust in each other. **One of my favorite parts about Nik and Nera's relationship is that Nera holds a lot of the control and Nik is perfectly comfortable with that.** He appreciates Nera's strength and he loves her for exactly who she is.

I also really liked that Jonas Solomon was in this one and I can't wait to hopefully get his book sometime in the future. He's got such swagger and bravado but you can tell it's hiding something deep and likely painful.

This one definitely had its scary moments. It was totally awesome, but there were points where I was completely creeped out. All in the service of an excellent story. One that reminds me a bit of H.G. Wells' The Time Machine. It felt like I met the Morlocks, and they are us.

The Phoenix Adventures are all about the Phoenix Brothers, and occasionally their cousins, who are intergalactic treasure hunters (think Han Solo's time period combined with Indiana Jones' profession, and if you envision a young Harrison Ford it doesn't hurt – at all!)

So far, two of the Phoenix Brothers, Dathan and Zayn, have found their true loves, In At Star's End and In the Devil's Nebula but their youngest brother Niklas has been left out in the cold. He left his career as an astro-archaeologist behind when he discovered that the famous Galactic Institute of Historic Preservation is run by a bunch of cut-throat, corrupt smugglers. He decided to join his brothers and do honest treasure hunting instead. All ironies intended. The prestigious Institute is a gang of thieves, and he and his brothers, mercenary treasure hunters, are pretty much above board.

He's also too wrapped up in the mysterious treasure-hunter Nera Darc to find someone else he could love the way that his brothers do their wives. The way that Darc keeps showing up in their hunts and either stealing the prize right out from under them, or helping to save their lives (sometimes both), keeps Nik hoping for more.

Then the Institute, his former employers, recruit him for a treasure hunt of their own. When Darc joins the expedition, Nik can't resist. Not that he was resisting much in the first place. The expedition is going to be the first to go back to old Earth, our Earth, to see what artifacts might be left after centuries of nuclear winter.

The last expedition to even observe the cradle of humanity from space found only black seas, grey land and lethally high radiation. Earth has gone dark.

But as Nik's expedition discovers, not as dead as everyone thought. Just deadly enough that their expedition is going to leave more than a few bodies on its surface. The only question is whether one of those bodies will be Nik's, with Nera Darc right beside him.

Or has the corrupt Institute finally over-extended its filthy reach?

Escape Rating A-: For those of us who have been with this series from the beginning At Star's End, it's been a long and wild ride to get to this glorious finish.

And it was so worth it.

There have always been questions about what exactly happened with Nik and the Institute. He gave up the career he loved, but he didn't fight to right the wrongs he uncovered. That's not Nik. That's not any of the Phoenix Brothers. It was terrific to finally get the answers to exactly what went wrong. It was even better to have those wrongs finally come right.

There has also always been a question (or two or three dozen) about Nera Darc and why she finds it necessary to keep taunting the Phoenix Brothers and especially why she keeps teasing Nik. She obviously has some feelings beyond simple rivalry, but she never sticks around long enough for Nik to explore them. She's the one that keeps getting away, and he needs to figure out why or find a way to move past her. This expedition is Nik's chance to get to know Nera and discover if all that teasing can possibly lead to something more.

The revelations of Nera's background are heart-breaking. That she uses her past pain to help someone else in need is a wonderful part of the story, and shows how much she has healed. The fits and starts in her developing relationship with Nik show just how far she still needs to go.

But in the middle of the building romance, there is the expedition. While it is pretty clear from the beginning who is gunning for Nik (and who else is gunning for Nera), some of the ulterior motives were a surprise. Not that expedition leader Avril didn't come off as way too good to be true, but the depths of what she was covering up were deeper and more disgusting than I imagined.

The story of the expedition itself, both what they find and how they find it, chilled me to the bone. The portrait of the post-apocalyptic dark Earth is appropriately awful. The explanations of how things got to their final pass make all too much sense.

But what they see is frightening. The results of screwing it all up so very badly. At first, they believe that our world is dead. Then they discover that it is much, much worse. And also slightly better, but in a very twisted way.

The landscape is against them, and so is the extremely mutated wildlife. The oceans are black, and the land consists of black sand blast radii and deadly and mutated plant life, with even more mutated and deadly animal life. It's a world that has turned on itself and turns on anyone who tries to discover its secrets.

Their final attempt at wrenching out some of the planet's secrets says way more about them than it does about what they discover. The Institute attempts a rape of cultural misappropriation on an epic scale, and it finally bites them in the ass. Just because people seem primitive doesn't mean that they aren't way better at exploiting their environment than you are. It also doesn't mean that they aren't better people than you are. Technological superiority does not mean actual superiority.

The scenes of the surviving human population did remind me of the Morlocks in H.G. Wells Time Machine, and seemed all too plausible, where Wells did not.

And in this case, it wasn't just that the so-called natives had way more moral superiority than the Institute, it was that in this case they managed to prevail. Technological superiority turned out not to mean more civilized. Or even more human.
