Young children will also have the opportunity to identify some animals while reading this book, and older readers can spot the cause and effect things that will lead to later events in the book. Splat the Cat fans will continue to enjoy his mishaps and adventures in this fun field trip book.

I think the thing I enjoyed best about this book was the casual, light, 4th wall breaks. The glint in someone's eye as he looks out of the page, the real feel of the illustrations (I brushed my book a couple of times because I really thought there was loose hairs), and the glossy pages bring to life these realistic drawings. The full bleed pages, the carefully placed text boxes, and the great story really pulled me into this book. I enjoyed it very much.
