Kane's Hell by Elizabeth Finn is a story filled with a lot of pain from the past yet hope for a happy future. Kane and Helene were best friends since childhood. He was the popular "player" while she was the quiet loner. Their differences didn't matter because they had a special connection, a connection they never thought could be severed. Until one dark night at age seventeen. All the carefree innocence teens savor...gone. The next day, so was Kane. Gone without a trace, leaving Helene to pick up the pieces alone.

Helene has lived the past eleven years since that night buried in her studies. She's never spoke of the events, internalizing her pain, letting it fuel her desire to succeed academically. A doctoral student at Penn State Hazleton, she's currently teaching a Philosophy class when her past comes colliding with her present. Kane is back...a student in her class.

Kane, in the other hand, has lived the past eleven years punishing himself for the events of that fateful night. Binge drinking, fights, one night stands...he's done anything BUT succeed. But when he hears Hell is back in Hazleton, he can't resist the chance to see her again. He knows it's a mistake, knows the past needs to stay buried yet she's a draw he can't resist.

Kane's Hell is a torturous second-chance love story that elicited a plethora of emotions in me. The events of eleven years ago are trickle fed via chapters from the past. It's also in dual POV which puts the reader front row center in each of their heads. This was impeccably done. Sometimes back and forth timelines muddle things for me. Not so here.

It's no secret my love of this author. Her plot lines and writing style just click for me- always filled with all

kinds of angst and emotions. When I'd read this book had a bit of darkness, I couldn't wait to get my hands on it. That being said, I think it's **imperative** this book have a bit of a disclaimer. The scene from that fateful night is a bit graphic. Not because it's super detailed, more so because Ms. Finn has such an innate ability to invest her reader's hearts fully into the story. Because of this, the scene affected me more than books that are much more graphic. It's just her way and also why I love her stories the way I do. So, I'll spoiler tag this. If there's triggers for readers related to certain violence, you may want to click it. Otherwise move along and **DO NOT** click spoiler. Let their story play out. (view spoiler)

It's fair to say Kane and Helene have a lot of struggles ahead. Both have chosen to deal with the past in their own ~~non-therapeutic~~ ways. Yet their connection stays strong from the day they see each other in that classroom. There's trust to be rebuilt yet their feelings have never changed. She is the one positive thing in Kane's life. Is it so bad to want it back?

Can Helene trust Kane again? Trust him not to cut and run when the going gets tough? Her brain says one thing. Her heart another.

I can't review an Elizabeth Finn book without highlighting the awesomeness of her sex scenes. Holy smoking panties she can write dirty talkers! I think that's why she's the whole package for me as far as authors go. She writes fairly complex plot lines of events that could clearly happen to anyone. She writes angst like no other- firmly grabbing ahold of the reader by the heart strings with thorough character development. You can't help but be emotionally invested in their love story. And the sex. Well, that's in a category all it's own. Scorching. It's read like erotica but not like the commonplace erotica we see in most books. And, most importantly, she always gives her readers a happily ever after. She may rip our hearts out of our chests throughout the book, but in the end, she heals us completely.

Elizabeth Finn has pinned yet another amazing book. That word "amazing" is kind of cliche. But I can't think of another word to describe this book any better then simply....amazing!

The story is told in dual POV through alternating chapters of past and present. I've said before I'm not a huge fan of flashbacks but if they're woven into the story just right they don't bother me. When it comes to the subject matter of these flashbacks I'm glad they were done in segments because they were so intense I don't think I could have taken the entire scene at once. So it turned out perfect.

Kane and Helene had been friends since they were children. Kane was the popular kid at school and Helene was a bookworm. Despite their completely different social statuses they were thick as thieves. None of Kane's friends ever understood why he spent so much time with Helene, even ditching them at lunch to sit with her, but there was just something between them that always drew them close. They could shut out the world and just be themselves together.

They worked together at a gas station that had a pizza shop too. Helene worked the gas station side while Kane made the pizzas. One slow deserted night at work events take place that shatter everything. That rip them apart in every way possible. Emotionally. Mentally. Physically.

Eleven years will pass before they are reunited. And they are not the same people they once were. Helene channeled all her energy into studying and becoming successful. She's attending Penn State at Hazleton and is teaching a philosophy class while also working on her dissertation to receive her doctorate degree. She has buried the events of that night very deep and wants it to stay that way, constantly forcing herself forward so she doesn't have to look back.

Their hopes and dreams were shattered instantly and anything that was growing between the two teenagers was crushed and swallowed up into oblivion. Kane disappears without a trace after this leaving Helene to cope on her own. They end up going down two very different roads. Helene, already a quiet and studious loner, immerses herself in school work eventually becoming a doctoral student working on her dissertation and an assistant professor at Penn State Hazleton. All the while, she has buried her emotions, pain and torment. With such an intense focus on her studies it allowed Helene to internalize all that she was struggling with emotionally. Kane takes a more destructive journey and falls into some heavy coping mechanisms. Fighting, meaningless sex and drinking were the vices of choice to mask his pain and punish himself – vices that are slowly and lethally destroying him.

Kane resurfaces eleven years later appearing in Helene's class and throwing her off course. Even though Kane knows that he should stay away from Helene and keep the past deeply buried where it should stay, he can't resist the pull when it comes to seeing her once again. Helene has worked hard to move forward with her life and move past the trauma and the nightmares. Seeing Kane again is the last thing she ever expected. She still does not understand how he could have left her when she was at her most hurt and vulnerable. Kane is there to fight for another chance with the only woman he has ever loved. He may feel like he is undeserving but that is not going to stop him from getting back what he longs for. He wants the both of them to forget the monsters in their past. But, can Helene forgive Kane and trust him enough to let him in? She already skates along some very fragile ice. Will allowing Kane into her world again be the weight that will have her falling into the ice cold waters and drowning once and for all? Is Kane there for the long haul this time or will he run when things get too tough?

This story is brilliantly told in three equally mesmerizing parts with the first part slowly incorporating and retelling what exactly occurred and changed Helene and Kane forever. Ms. Finn slowly feeds us pieces of the story. This new second-chance journey that Kane and his Hell embark on is definitely wrought with challenges and given that this is an Elizabeth Finn novel, you get a hefty dose of painful angst. It took me a bit to figure out how to rate and review this because so many things either pulled at my heartstrings or pissed me off.

Ms. Finn always has a way to incorporate questionable subjects and add them in a story to really make you think about your original morals and opinions on a debatable topic. She does it again with this story of Kane and Hell with a subject so controversial that I found myself changing my stance on it a few times.

But not only does she achieve a thought provoking story but she also adds in the philosophical aspect where different opinions are massaged into the underlying tale of Kane and Hell. It's a story about guilt, forgiveness, tragedy, moving forward, love, and justice. It's a story about two people broken from their past. Two people trying to move forward with their lives in different ways.

One event changed the lives of these two friends forever. One night eleven years ago put them both on a different path. A path away from each other. One traumatic experience shared. Fans of second chance romance prepare to get your hearts ripped out. I'm talking 'reach through your throat, make you ugly cry in a corner and fuck you up' kind of ripped out. It's no secret that this author writes some ANGST, but nothing prepared me for this book. Let me start off with a disclaimer here; I don't think this book is for everyone. There's a particular scene in this book that's a potential trigger and if you're sensitive to that sort of thing, well, be advised. Being a huge fan of dark romance I'm fairly desensitized to most things, but this scene even made me cringe. It was very difficult to read even if it wasn't overly descriptive. It broke my cold and black little heart dammit. I actually had to pause the book right after it just to get my shit together. Yeah. It was **that** effective.

Kane and Helene were best friends in high school and had a budding romance going which Kane was always hesitant to act on. But then one night and one event changed the course of their lives irrevocably. Prepare yourselves for one gut-wrenching read because this event? It was BAD. You don't know what it is and it will be retold through present to past flashbacks in the first third of the story.

I needed you, and you left me. You left me in this place to deal with...everything on my own.

What happened made Helene a shell of the woman that she once was. It took her years to wade her way out of the pain and nightmares especially since Kane left right after it, but she did it through her focus on school. Now eleven years later, she's teaching and working on her dissertation, using her education and her career to

push back the devastating memories. The last person she expects to walk into her classroom is the only person that knows what happened those years ago and shared the nightmare with her.

The last place Kane wants to be in is the one that reminds him of everything that he lost and the nightmares he barely keeps at bay. Where Helene uses her education and career to mask her pain, he uses self punishment in the form of fights, alcohol and sex. He craves the pain to punish himself. Back to care for his ailing father, he's determined to finally get the only girl that's ever had his heart.

If you've come to love Elizabeth's dirty talkers, Kane definitely delivers on that end. He also has that dash of asshole that you've come to expect from this author, though not overly so.

The story is told in 3 parts; the first third is told in alternating flashbacks of present to past, slowly retelling the nightmare that Hell and Kane shared together 11 years ago. The reader is given one small piece of the puzzle in each flashback until all the pieces begin to fit together into one devastating picture. The 2nd and 3rd part doesn't have the flashbacks and is told all in the present and focuses on Hell and Kane attempting to put their broken pieces together again.

Everything about us is fragile- our relationship, the way we communicate, the way we fuck. I always feel like I'm two seconds away from letting you slip through my fingers. It's all so very fucking fragile.

I did find the story dragging a little somewhere after the 40% mark and I found myself skimming a bit through a few of the sex scenes. I can't say that it read like a filler, not at all. But it was slower paced after the jaw dropping events of the first third.

I love you, Helene. I want you to know that. You're the only person I have ever and will ever love in this lifetime. I'm so good at loving you. It's the one thing I can safely say I will never falter at.

This was NOT a dark romance, but it certainly had much darker undertones than anything I had previously read by this author before. It had plenty of her trademark angst, dirty talk and hot as hell sex scenes. But beyond that it also had a beautifully painful second chance romance about two very broken people that slowly learn how to heal themselves and put back together their shattered pieces.

Now Kane's come back to sort his father's house out they both are having to confront their issues and see each other again by Kane enrolling in one of Helene's night class's to help with her dissertation and studies.

First off I have to discuss slightly this scene and how that hurt me *To. Be. Honest.* I struggled it was really difficult for me to read because it wasn't skimmed over you go through it bit by bit read it from the past and what they went though to present and how they deal with seeing each other the first 1/4 while this was going on truthfully it was HARD for me. I took a few breaks I love Angsty reads I love to cry and I love emotion but for me I struggled I'm not saying it wasn't needed that's just me and how I felt. WOAH. WOW. OMG. THE FEELS!!!!

This book was a non-stop roller coaster ride that I could not put down from the moment I started reading. Let me warn you though that it is not for the faint of heart. Part of the storyline is raw, dark and intensely gritty, but it's also deeply, beautifully, and painfully romantic. It's an emotional, erotic love story that just had this spark that kept my heart racing the whole way through. I absolutely loved it!!!

“I’m not good at much in this world... But I’m good at loving you,” I whispered.

I guess you could call it a second chance romance, but it would be more accurately described as a romance between a couple reunited years after a traumatic experience drove them apart. Kane and Helene (he calls her Hell) had been best friends in high school — an unlikely match with him being the popular and untouchable bad boy, and her being a more quiet and studious type — who cared deeply for each other and likely would have ended up together as a couple shortly after if a brutal attack hadn’t destroyed their lives. (I’m going to insert a spoiler tag below because I want to be very upfront that this part of the book likely has triggers for some readers.) Unable to cope with the trauma, Kane unexpectedly left town one night and she never heard from him again until a decade later when he walked into the university class she was now teaching... as a student. Despite the pain and years of separation, their connection and pull towards each other hadn’t diminished. She naturally had questions, but he couldn’t give her all the answers. Not yet. But he also couldn’t stay away from her and they slowly but carefully rekindled their romance... while working together to help each other heal and finally confront the past that had shattered them once before.

I looked up. “Kane.” I said his name and nothing more, but it was too breathy, too quiet.

“Hell.” He walked toward me slowly, his face sly and mischievous. He’d always had that countenance to him — as though nothing, not life, not nightmares, not boogiemen, nor monsters could rattle him. I’d loved that about him once. Of course it wasn’t true, and he was just as vulnerable to the monsters as I was.

Before anything, I want to address the dark part of the book because when I was originally considering reading this book, I desperately wanted to know what to expect and I couldn’t find this information anywhere. In the hidden spoiler link down below, I’m going to include full details what what this story element is so that you can make an informed decision whether or not it’s something you want to read.

She reached for my stomach, letting her palm cover the four inch scar that ran from my navel to the left side of my abdomen. It was her scar as much as mine, and she knew damn well she didn’t need my permission to touch it.

The main couple share a very painful past which could include triggers for some readers. It is genuinely horrific and not glossed over. (Note: there are several chapters – the flashbacks – near the beginning that had me questioning whether I could or even wanted to handle this story at all, but I’m so glad I kept going). Kane and Helene do get through it and past it, and their journey back together and the way they helped each other heal through their undeniable and undying love for each other was just gorgeous.

Going back to the dark though, I can say that I honestly almost stopped reading during one of the flashbacks because I just felt it was too much. Like really, I did not want that much detail. It was horrifically painful and kinda drawn out. I think readers who are used to darker romance will be fine with the scenes (okay, not rainbows-and-unicorns fine, but you’ll be able to handle it) and others will potentially be totally turned off the book by it. It’s really fucking brutal, okay?

“Can’t we just forget about the monsters?” he whispered, his lips touching and teasing my earlobe. “All I want to remember is us.”

So, without a doubt, what they’d been through together was scarring in the worst way, and how Kane especially had handled it made things even more painful. The eleven years of separation had left many emotional gaps between them but their connection to each other had never faded and despite the rocky terrain they had to go over on their journey back together, you could just tell that they were both trying so hard to be functional and healthy together in an open, honest way. They were committed to each other to the point where I couldn’t help but believe that they belonged together.

I loved the way they just kept gravitating back to each other — always back to each other. Even though their worst memories were with each other, they were each also the only person with whom the other truly felt safe — both emotionally and physically. Everything about the emotions they went through made sense to me. The hesitation, the guilt, the questions, the desperation to reconnect, the love that kept pulling them together. Both their pain and their joy was portrayed in such a believable fashion.

“What do you want from me?” Tears fell down her cheeks...

“I need to be close to you,” I admitted, feeling my lips tremble to. “Please let me be close to you... I want to talk to you, and I want you to talk to me. I want to touch you, and I want you to touch me, too. I want to hold you.” I gave up hiding the tears, and when I blinked they ran down my cheeks... “I want all of you, regardless of the fact I deserve nothing from you... We deserve to go back and be us again. Not the us that came after that night. The us before. We were good for each other. I was good for you once — even if no one else in the world saw it or understood that.”

This book is explicitly erotic so it’s definitely an Adult romance. Kane’s a dirty talker and they do spend a lot of time reconnecting sexually as well as emotionally. Despite how much sex there is in the book, I honestly didn’t feel it was too much. It made sense for the story and given the nature of their shared trauma, it made sense to me that they’d use it in part as a way of healing.

“Please don’t make me a bad memory. Let me be a good one.”

It's worth mentioning again that my favorite part of this book was reading about characters who are trying their best to make a healthy relationship work despite many outside factors working against them. Another good example of this is the Crossfire series. Their shared triumphs and pitfalls, ups and downs, and the way they worked together to be together is what I love to read about most.

“You’re saying the emotional side of all this is more complicated?”

“Do you see it any other way?” he asked.

I turned my body toward him... “No, I don’t.”

“Hey.” He pulled my face to look at him... “Complicated is okay.”

Another thing I really liked were the scenes in her classroom where they discussed various philosophical aspects that inevitably were turned back around in a way that actually brought the story very much ‘full circle’ by the end. I thought the integration of this particular aspect of the story was very well done and greatly helped to provide balance to the story.

Please be aware that even though I loved this book, I do not think that it will be something that every single reader will necessarily love because of the darker elements. Again, if you’re hesitant, please read the spoiler tag above to help you make an informed decision. I always get nervous recommending books that have this level of grit to them because I don’t want a more sensitive reader to be too shocked by its content. That being said, if you’re the kind of reader who craves dark, gritty, emotionally intense stories then you definitely have to give this book a shot. Hopefully this review will help make the decision easy.

For the record though, there is nothing else dark about this book other than their past. Their present is just about healing and coping and finding a way to rebuild their lives together. But there’s no more dark.

“I’ve missed you so fucking much,” he said quietly. “Nothing has made sense in my life without you.”

As you get closer to the end, you slowly become aware of what Kane is planning and OMG my heart sank. I understood why he wanted to do it, but I was soooo worried. I desperately flipped the pages unsure about whether or not I wanted him to go through with it or not. Like their philosophy discussions in class, this was such a grey area and I desperately needed to know they’d be okay. By 95% I was seriously freaking the fuck out. But I can reassure you without giving away too much that this book has a truly beautiful ending (that includes an epilogue). It’s completely satisfactory in a way where you could really tell that the author put in the thought to genuinely bring their story full circle.

“We’re going to be okay,” I said as I wrapped my arms around her. I had no doubt she could be okay all on her own without my presence in her life. But I also had no doubt I never would be without her. “We’re going to be okay,” I repeated.

The story is told in first person perspective and alternating points of view between Kane and Helene. The story is separated into three main parts and the first part includes flashbacks to that night. But other than that, the rest of the storyline is present-day and forward moving. I really enjoyed the writing. The author paid attention to all the right details in a way that really made me able to connect strongly with the story on an emotional level. And the steam factor is HIGH. This is definitely an erotic romance.

I loved this book. I couldn't put it down even for a moment. It was a really fantastic blend of raw gritty edginess, steamy erotic romance, and intensely emotional healing that kept me glued to the page with my heart racing. It's not a story for the faint of heart, but it's most definitely a new favorite for me!
