Nine-year-old Tori is thrilled to be spending the whole summer with her grandmother at Silver Pony Ranch. She is most excited about the new pony, Jewel, whom she is desperate to be allowed to ride. Gran assures Tori that she'll be able to ride Jewel eventually, after the pony has warmed up to her, but Tori's impatience gets her into a few sticky situations first.

Sparkling Jewel is a story that will fulfill the wishes of many young girls who love horses. For those who dream of a pony of their own, the opportunity to live vicariously through Tori and her sister, Miranda, will be reason enough to read this book. Unfortunately, aside from the high-interest content, this book is not especially memorable. The writing is flat and predictable, and the illustrations, like those in the Amazing Stardust Friends books, look like they came straight out of the 1980s. When so many of the other Branches books are so attractive, it is puzzling that odd-looking books like this one make it to the publication stage. Also completely surprising is the striking difference between this book and the author's Zeke Meeks series. The Zeke books are clever, timely, and unique. This book does not at all live up to that standard.

Branches continually does a great job of offering many different types of books for many different types of readers. This book, despite its weaknesses, will attract readers, especially reluctant ones. That said, there are plenty of other books which address the same subject matter with better writing and in a more attractive-looking package. Suggested alternatives include Saige by Jessie Haas, Libby of High Hopes by Elise Primavera, and Amber Brown Horses Around by Elizabeth Levy and Bruce Coville.

The big difference I see here from the other Branches books is that these illustrations are more like black-and-white sketches. In the other books the colorful and bold illustrations really seem to draw in the reader and I think this book will lose kids because of that missing piece.
