This is a wonderful, leather bound collection of all twenty three of Beatrix Potter's tales. Four are ones that were never published when she was alive. A great addition is a little forward before each story, giving a little backstory about the book and when it was published. It was a wonderful insight into Potter's life. The stories are arranged on how they first were published, so you get one of the best right off the bat with "The Tale of Peter Rabbit", a book I fondly remember having as a child in the form of a miniature book. Peter Rabbit is well known in culture, even by people who have not read the story. Beatrix Potter's art work is so gorgeous,

sometimes over shadowing the story accompanying it. The language is a bit advanced for young children, being written in the early 20th century. Many words have passed beyond everyday use. And not every work is a great one. There are certainly some duds and others that take too long to get to any point. There was one story that I remember well, "The Tale of Two Bad Mice", but was nervous rereading. I have such a vivid memory of sitting on my grandfather's stomach as he read it to me as a child. I lost my grandpa when I was four years old, so I feared that the memory might be sullied if the story was not as delightful as I remember. It was just a wonderful as I recalled though. The little mice ruining the doll house is so enduring, especially when they try to make up for their naughtiness at the end. I loved taking the time to read all of these aloud with my husband prior to children arriving in our household. I have a good understanding of what stories to start with, and which to wait for a child to get older.

It was good to read all the stories, but the quality is somewhat mixed. There are great ones like Peter Rabbit, but there are other ones that seemed to make no sense at all. By that, I don't mean to me as an adult, but even to children - I couldn't imagine reading some of these to my own kids, in particular the Tale of Ginger and Pickles.
